### Asset of Community Value nominations

Grade II Site of Interest for Nature Conservation in Kidderpore Avenue: declined because not recently open to public

Kidderpore Hall: declined because not in public use in last five years

Camden Arts Centre: in progress

West Heath Lawn Tennis Club: in progress.

### Completion of Evidence Base

The Forum's policies are very well supported by an extensive evidence base, including:

- Vision and Objectives Survey – completed by nearly 200 respondents (9% response rate, on the basis of 1 questionnaire per household and 2,000 households)
- AECOM Heritage and Character Assessment. Copies are available at £15 each
- AECOM Contribution of Trees to Townscape Character report
- Arup Underground Rivers Mapping report – based on new research
- Ecology Network Bat Flight Path Map

NO2 monitoring at selected sites, including local schools and Briardale Gardens (from own funds)

Redfrog analysis of planning consents granted, resulting in loss of gardens and trees

### Policy Drafting

Create Streets appointed to produce first draft of Neighbourhood Plan Policies and Basic Condition Statement.

CIL project list included, based on Vision and Objectives Survey responses

Identified all Quennell and WJ King houses for inclusion in Plan to exert pressure on Camden to obtain a local listing

First draft of Policies has been submitted to Camden and comments awaited.
